

CAMERA PLANNING WORKSHEET

Below are the most common areas for security camera placement. Count how many you need in each location to determine the total number of cameras you need in your system.

Note:

It is good practice when planning a system to leave at least two free channels on your NVR. This will leave room for future expansion by adding more cameras. It will also give you better performance on your NVR, including faster response and more video storage.

	Back door
	First floor windows
	Windows that do not face the street
	Garage Door
	Basement door/side doors
	Gates
	Detached garages - cover both the main garage door and any side doors
	Storage or garden sheds
	Other outbuildings such as a barn
	Swimming pools or other play structures
	Interior rooms with valuables or dangerous items
	Interior rooms you want to monitor (nursery, playroom, etc)

	Number of entries (front door, back door, side entrance, etc)
	Note : Placing an interior camera facing people as they enter is recommended for businesses who serve the public
	Cash Registers and/or POS terminals
	High target items for theft (safes, electronics, alcohol or tobacco products, sensitive documents, etc)
	Stairs and Walkways
	Parking lots
	Any exterior structures that house inventory or other valuable items
